HOUSE RULES

ARTICLE I: MEMBERSHIP PROGRAMS

Classes of Membership: (*restrictions)

Regular Family	Pool Social
Regular Individual	Dining
Young Professional Family	*Non-Resident
Golf Social	*Corporate

The **REGULAR MEMBERSHIPS FAMILY OR INDIVIDUAL** will provide the privileges of all Club facilities for the holder, spouse, and dependent children under eighteen (18) years of age. However, if the latter is living in the parental home and is a full-time college student, in which case said student may be a member until age twenty-five (25). Membership restrictions are regular member in good standing and must have paid regular dues for no less than five (5) years. For addition, information please contact the Accounting Department.

The **YOUNG PROFESSIONAL FAMILY MEMBERSHIP** will provide the privileges of all Club facilities for the holder up to age 39, for the spouse, and dependent children. Young Professional Individual golf privileges are for the primary member only. Some golf limitations may apply. The birth date of the primary Young Professional Family Member will determine the annual or monthly dues.

The **GOLF SOCIAL MEMBERSHIP** will provide the holder five (5) rounds of golf during the membership year for the holder. Weekend and Holiday tee off is permitted after 12:00pm. The Golf Social Member may play as a guest on weekends and Holidays before 12:00pm, but must pay applicable greens fees, and the round will be counted against the twelve (12) Golf Social membership rounds. Golf Social Members may participate in all Innsbrook CC golf events (based upon availability) except the Club Championship. Driving range privileges are included in the Golf Social membership for Member and their golfing guests on the day they are playing golf; or member may select to pay the \$175 fee for unlimited use of the Driving Range. Spouse and dependent children may play golf counted against the five (5) rounds of the holder. Spouse and dependent children may enjoy food and beverages, special events, and pool privileges. Children, ages five (5) through sixteen (16) of Golf Social Members may participate in the Junior Golf Program. Refer to the ProShop for details.

The **POOL SOCIAL MEMBERSHIP** will provide to the holder, spouse, and dependent children, under 25 years of age, the privileges of all Club facilities including food, beverage, pool, and special events. Pool Social Members may golf up to five (5) times in a calendar year paying the greens fee of \$55. Pool Social Members are subject to the same limitations, rules, and greens fees as unaccompanied guests. Children, ages five (5) through sixteen (16) of Pool Social Members may participate in the Junior Golf Program.

The **DINING CLUB MEMBER** may enjoy the rights and privileges of the Clubhouse facilities for dining, entertainment and private celebrations. This membership does not include pool nor golf privileges. The Member may participate in all ICC private events such as Christmas parties, Easter Egg Hunt, Holiday Buffets, Wine Tastings, Dance Lessons, etc. Children, ages five (5) through sixteen (16) of Dining Club Members may participate in the Junior Golf Program. Refer to Proshop for details.

The **CORPORATE MEMBERSHIP** affords a Company, Partnership or Corporation the privileges of all Club facilities for the Primary and Secondary Members, spouses, and dependent children less than eighteen (18) years of age. However, if the latter is living in the parental home and is a full-time college student, in which case the said student may be a member until the age twenty-five. For full privileges, one individual joins as the Primary Member with a minimum of two and a maximum of four Secondary Members. It is the perfect membership for executives or marketing staffs that need the asses of a private club environment in which to



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entertain. Granting of ICC membership (or membership requirements) is at the sole discretion of the Innsbrook Country Club owners.

The **NON-RESIDENT MEMBERSHIP** will provide the privileges of all Club facilities for the holder and will provide golf up to (15) times annually. The Non-Resident Member may participate in all golf events (based upon availability) except the Club Championship. The Non-Resident Member will not have a minimum house charge. The Non-Resident primary residence must be at least 125 miles (distance wise) from Innsbrook Country Club.

BOCCE BALL privileges are included in most memberships for the holder, spouse and dependent children 18 years old or older.

Dependent Children are the age twenty-five (25) and under.

ARTICLE II: SCHEDULE OF MEMBER CHARGES - 2021

Initiation Fee

The Club shall determine an initiation fee to be paid by any new Member upon admittance into the Club. If membership is resigned prior to the one-year or two-year commitments as outlined in the Memberships, member(s) will be billed the full initiation fees.

Capital Replacement Yearly Fee

Paid by all Members (except Dining and Non-Resident) in the month of May \$150.

Notice of Resignation / Membership Category Change

Notice of resignation from the Club or request for membership change must be transmitted in writing to the business office within 30 days. A new membership must be in effect for a minimum of 24 months from the date the membership change goes into effect. The exception is Pool Social Memberships, which are in effect for a minimum of 12 months from the date the membership goes into effect. 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Minimum House Account Charges:

REGULAR

Food and beverage charges have a semi-annual minimum of \$300. These charges are cumulative for six months, April 1-Sept. 30 and Oct. 1-March 31st. Members have the option of prepaying \$600 (the annual amount) and having the entire 12-month period to satisfy this amount. No monthly minimum will be billed, and food and beverage usage will be applied towards the \$600.00 prepayment until the amount is exhausted. Any of the prepayment not used by the end of the cycle will be forfeited.

Minimum House Account Charges

YOUNG PROFESSIONALS, GOLF SOCIAL, & POOL SOCIAL

Food and beverage charges have a semi-annual minimum of \$150. These charges are cumulative for six months, April 1-Sept. 30 and Oct. 1-March 31st. Members have the option of prepaying \$300 or \$360 (the annual amount) and having the entire 12-month period to satisfy this amount. No monthly minimum will be billed, and food and beverage usage will be applied towards the \$300 or \$360 prepayment until the amount is exhausted. Any of the prepayment not used by March 31st will be forfeited. If the Food Minimum is prepaid and the Membership is resigned, the prepaid amount will be not be refunded.

Minimum House Account Charges

CLUBHOUSE / DINING MEMBERSHIP

Food and beverage charges have a semi-annual minimum of \$180. These charges are cumulative for six months, April 1-Sept. 30 and Oct. 1-March 31. Members have the option of prepaying \$360 (the annual amount) and having the entire 12-month period to satisfy this amount. No monthly minimum will be billed, and food and beverage usage will be applied towards the \$360 prepayment until the amount is exhausted. Any prepayment not used by March 31st will be forfeited. Note: Dining Club Memberships Specials do not have a Food and Beverage Minimum.

Guest Policy

While Innsbrook Country Club is a private golf club, we encourage guest play. Guests may play in either of these two manners:

- Accompanied:** A guest plays with a member.
- *Unaccompanied:** A guest is sponsored by a member prior to play.

Guest fees include access to all practice facilities and range balls. Locker room facilities are available upon request. Guests may pay with a major credit card. *Unaccompanied guests may tee off after 12:00pm. on weekends and holidays.

**Note: May apply to all memberships not listed. Driving range fee is an option for the Golf Social memberships. Non-Golfing Members: Pool and Dining memberships have the option of paying the annual driving range fee and will then have full driving range privileges.

This is an optional fee billed yearly in October on your statement. All requests to opt must be given to the Accounting Department within thirty (30) days. Please note charges will not be reversed after the end of the year.

Swimming Pool Guest Fees:

Per Guest (Adults and Children) **\$ 8.00 per guest**

A member may have no more than six guests on any given day. More than six guests (per membership) on any one day are considered a "party" and must be scheduled in advance with the Pool Manager. The Member sponsoring the guest(s) is responsible for properly registering the guest(s) and for paying the guest fee. The sponsoring member must remain present at Innsbrook during the entire guest visit. There is no guest fee charged for Grandparents or Nanny/Caretakers of members' dependent children when accompanied by the dependent children of the primary holder who hold memberships which entitle pool privileges. Note for Nanny/Caretakers a written notice from the primary member must be received at Innsbrook and authorized by management prior to admission.

ARTICLE III: RULES & REGULATIONS and GENERAL INFORMATION - 2021

Accounts:

1. **Purchases:** Members may choose to sign tickets for all charge purchases at the Club or they may pay with a major credit card.
2. **Payment:** Every member will be billed for all Club charges on or about the first of each month. Payment is due on presentation and shall be made by personal check or major credit card by the 15th; unless you became members to the club after 2015 then it will be set for autopay. Autopay is required for all Memberships. Undersigned further agrees that if any statement or account balance is not paid within the thirty (30) day period, the entire account balance will be charged to the bank account information on file with an auto payment/ACH transaction. Member is responsible for all costs, including reasonable attorney fees, expenses, and court costs incurred in the case of collection of indebtedness.
3. **Delinquent or Overdue Accounts:** The full amount due must be paid by the last day of the month in which the statement is received. Failure to make payment as required will cause the member's account to be considered delinquent. If payment is not made within 60 days of the statement date **your credit card will be automatically charged** and written notice of the delinquency and of the possible suspension shall be emailed or mailed to the member. If payment is not made, in full, within fifteen days of the mailing of such notice, the privileges of such member shall be suspended. All members must always have a valid credit card on file at ALL times.
4. **Interest Charged:** Once delinquent, the amount due shall bear interest at the rate of 1.5% per month until paid in full. The privileges of a suspended person will not be reinstated until the account of such person is paid in full. While suspended, a person will not be allowed the use of the Club facilities as a guest of any member. The denial of privileges of a person suspended will extend to all dependents entitled to use the Club based on the membership of the suspended person.
5. **Exceptions:** Exceptions to the above policy shall be granted only by action of the Club owners for good cause shown.

Club House Facilities:

1. **General:** The main Club House facilities that are generally available for members, their families and guests, include the Innsbrook Ballroom seats 220, the Member Grille/Sports bar seats 100, Langford's Dining Room seats 70, the Berkshire Room seats 50, the Chicago Room seats 50, Board Room seats 20, the Celebration Room seats 12, the Golf Pro Shop, the Pool House, Bocce Ball Courts and the Golf Course Halfway House. The hours of operation and meal service vary according to the season and will be available on the Innsbrook CC web site and in the Member Newsletter. Reservations are recommended for dinner any night the Club is open in order to assist the staff in their preparations for serving members and guests in a timely fashion.



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2. **Dress Code:** The Club has dress code policies, which differ depending on the area, and members should inform their guests and family members of the dress code requirements. Any questions about the dress code requirements for a particular area or specific event may be directed to the Director of Operations or the PGA Golf Professional. These employees have been directed by the Club Owner to enforce the dress code requirements of the Club. These dress code standards are applicable to members and their guests. Failure to observe these standards will result in a denial of admission to the dining facilities.

Dress for dining may be casual and informal unless specific attire is required in the dining room for special functions. The following clothing items are prohibited in the clubhouse: cutoffs, tee shirts, numeral jerseys, tank tops, halter tops, tube tops, tennis shorts, short shorts, swim attire (including cover-ups). Shirts must always be tucked in. Hats and visors must be worn bill forward. Suitable jeans/denim is acceptable. If a Member or guest wishes to wear shorts, it is required that the length of the shorts be that of the traditional Bermuda short. Appropriate dress is expected for children seated in the dining room.

Formal dress may be required for special events. Formal dress for men (age 13 or older) requires a suit jacket or sport coat with long trousers. Formal dress for ladies requires a dress, suit or pantsuit. Children are expected to be properly dressed. Special events sponsored by the Club or special dispensations granted by the Club Owner may allow less formal attire. Notice of these special events or dispensations will be by special notice to the Members.

3. **Locker Rooms:** The Club House has two locker room facilities, one for men and one for women. The Women's Locker Room is available for any female member, spouses of a male member, or female guest. Men's Locker Room is available for any male member, spouses of a female member, or male guest. No person under the age of 18 will be permitted in either locker room unless supervised by an adult. At any time that sufficient lockers are not available for all Regular, Young Professional, or Golf Social a member with more than one locker will be required to give up extra lockers in sufficient quantities to enable all Regular, Young Professional or Golf Members to have a locker. Those members who most recently acquired an additional locker will be required to give up their additional locker first. Innsbrook Country Club Owner and Management are not responsible for loss of or damage to personal property due to theft, flood, fire or other causes.
4. **Golf Shop:** The Golf Shop is owned by Innsbrook Country Club and this facility is available to all Members and their family and guests. It offers a complete line of golf equipment and apparel and has facilities for custom building, altering and repairing golf clubs. Guests of members may make purchases using their personal credit cards. However, the member shall always be responsible for any purchase by a guest if problems arise.

Private Parties:

1. Please contact the Banquet Department 219-980-9060 (x205) for assistance in planning your upcoming event. They specialize in weddings, private dinner parties, showers, corporate meetings, funeral luncheons, and much more. A banquet coordinator will be more than happy to help customize your special occasion.
2. A signed contract and deposit are required to confirm your event. All banquets and events are subject to 7% sales tax and 20% gratuity.



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Responsibilities:

The Club is not responsible for the loss of property or for any other loss sustained by members or their guests while on Club premises.

Prohibitions:

General - Everyone using the Club is required to comply with all the rules. In order to provide further guidance, the following are specific prohibitions:

1. Dogs - Dogs shall not be permitted in the Club House or on Club grounds.
2. Flowers, Trees and Shrubs - No Member or guest are permitted to gather flowers or shrubs from the Club grounds.
3. Messengers - No Member shall ask an employee to leave the Club premises on any errand or matter of personal business.
4. Minors - The sale of cigarettes or alcohol to minors is prohibited.
5. Solicitations - No subscription paper or petition shall be circulated, nor any article advertised or exposed for sale in the Club House or on the Club grounds without the express written permission of the Club owners.
6. Food and Beverage - Members and guests are prohibited from bringing food and beverages on Club property.
7. Lightning - When the Club siren/horn blows indicating the presence of lightning, all play on the golf course and other outdoor facilities shall cease.
8. Employee Abuse - Members and guests are not permitted to abuse any Club employee verbally or otherwise.
9. Reprimand of Employees - Members or guests shall not reprimand employees. Inattention to duty or any discourtesy should be reported promptly to the employee's supervisor.
10. Harassment - Member shall not violate Club's anti-harassment policy.
11. Outside Providers - Outside providers of services or goods are prohibited except with the written authorization of the Club Owner.
12. Special Service Providers - Special service providers such as barbers, physical trainers, etc. shall not be permitted except by written authorization of the Club Owners.
13. Telephone Usage - Members and their guests are strongly discouraged from using cellular phones on the golf course. Members are asked to be considerate of fellow Members when using cellular phones and to restrict phone usage to Club House areas, keeping telephone usage to a minimum.
14. Ball Hawking - Other than searching for your own ball or one of a playing companion, ball hawking is prohibited.
15. Music/speakers: Members and their guests are strongly discouraged from playing music on the golf course, loud music is prohibited. Members are asked to be considerate of fellow members when using electronic devices and to restrict usage to Club House areas, keeping usage to a minimum.



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ARTICLE IV: USE OF THE GOLF FACILITIES – 2021

INNSBROOK COUNTY CLUB ONLY ACCEPTS CREDIT CARDS AS PAYMENT

Beginning on Opening Day - Pro Shop:

MONDAY	10am to 6pm (subject to golf outing schedule)
TUESDAY THRU FRIDAY	7am to 6pm
SATURDAY, SUNDAY, HOLIDAYS	6:30am to 7pm

Reserving Starting Times:

1. Regular Members may reserve tee times up to one week in advance.
Example: Saturday reservations may be made on the previous Saturday.
2. The Pro Shop voicemails will be received at approximately 7:00 AM.

Updated Golf Rules for 2021:

1. All Spouses, when golfing with the Regular Member, will have no tee-off time restrictions.
2. All Dependent Children (under the age of 18) of Golfing Members, approved by the golf professional for play based on age and ability, will be allowed to play or practice on Weekends and Holidays after 12:00pm, unless authorized by the Golf Professional. All Children must be accompanied by an adult to play on weekends.
3. All other classifications of Golfing Members may reserve a starting time for the Weekend and/or Holiday on the Wednesday before.

Spouses and approved children may reserve a starting time for the weekend and/or holiday beginning on the Thursday before.

4. As a courtesy to our Golfing Members, golf carts are recommended before 12:00pm on Saturdays, Sundays, and Holidays.
5. Walking will be at the discretion of the Golf Professional.
6. These changes will be in effect for the remainder of the golf season and will be re-evaluated annually.
7. Tuesday Ladies: 2:00pm to 4:00pm (approximate times)

Non-Golfing Members (Pool Social, Clubhouse*, and Dining) may golf up to five (5) times in a calendar year paying the greens fee of \$55. Non-Golfing Members are subject to the same limitations, rules, and greens fees as unaccompanied guests. *previous memberships



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Golf Course Rules and Regulations - Members and Guests:

1. **All players and guests must register in the golf shop before their round of golf.**
2. All carts must be returned directly to the cart path at the green posts alongside the fairway. No carts may pass beyond the green posts.
3. **Dress Code:** Dress on the golf course shall conform to the style of clothing sold in the Golf Shop. Cutoffs, jeans, tee shirts of any kind, numeral jerseys, swim attire (including cover-ups), tennis attire, halter tops, short-shorts, and other such abbreviated attire are not acceptable at any time. Shirts must always be tucked in. Hats and visors are to be worn bill forward. If a member or guest wishes to wear shorts, it required that the length of the shorts be that of the traditional Bermuda Shorts. Appropriate dress is expected for children of members.
4. Repair ball marks on greens.
5. Replace divots in rough only. Use sand and seed mix on tees and fairways.
6. **Operation of Carts:** All golf cart operators must have a valid driver's license and be familiar with the rules governing the operation of electric golf carts on the golf course and Club grounds. Furthermore, cart operators must either be members or guests. For liability reasons, children of members without a valid driver's license may not operate carts regardless of whether their parent is present or not. For the protection of the golf course and safety of members and their guests, golf cart operators must control the acceleration of the golf cart to avoid spinning or skidding of wheels during the starting or stopping of the golf carts. Golf carts must be driven at safe speeds and must not be driven on or near tees, slopes of bunkers, sand traps or greens. Golf carts must be kept a minimum of twenty (20) yards from greens and kept on paths near tees and greens. **A member or guest driving a cart is responsible for any personal injury or property damage caused including, without limitation, injury to him/herself or others and damage to the cart or course.** Loading – only (2) persons and two (2) bags may be carried on a golf cart.
7. Walk around bunkers and traps.
8. **Handicaps:** The Club utilizes the Chicago District Golf Association (CDGA) handicap system.
 - a. It shall be the responsibility of every golfer, upon completion of each round, to return the assigned scorecard complete with golfers' first and last names to the professional staff for posting.
 - b. The Club will sponsor golf events which may require that the golfer have posts a certain number of scores or have a specified handicap index in order to qualify. Information about the events will be published in the Innsbrook Country Club Member Newsletter and/or posted on bulletin boards in the Club House/ProShop.
9. **Practice:** Practice is restricted to the practice areas. The full swing facility and chipping areas have practice balls, which shall not be taken out onto the golf course.
 - a. The practice facilities are available for use by all Golfing Members, their spouses and dependent children. In addition, guests who have been registered at the Golf Shop may use the practice facilities.
 - b. An adult must supervise children under the age of eighteen (18) using any of the practice facilities. All children, under the age of eighteen (18), must surrender their tee station on the full swing facility to Members and their guests when the facility is full.



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10. **Pace of Play:**

- a. Foursomes – No playing group shall be composed of more than four (4) players unless authorized by the Golf Professional.
- b. Time – Groups will be expected to play at a pace equivalent to 14 minutes for par 3's, 15 minutes for par 4's, and 16 minutes for par 5's. This translates to an 18-Hole pace of 4 hours and 30 minutes.
- c. Keeping Pace – Groups are to maintain their starting interval and keep up with the group in front of them. Any group found to be the equivalent of two full shots and putting green behind the group in front of them AND is not on time per the Pace of Play Chart, may be approached by the Pro Shop and informed that their group is out of position. After second warning, group will be asked to pick up and skip a hole in order to get back on pace of play.

Guest Playing Policies:

Persons entitled to golfing privileges, and eligible to play at the particular time in accordance with their membership classification, may entertain guests governed by the following restrictions and with the approval of the Golf Professional:

1. One guest is allowed, per member, one per foursome, prior to 10:00am on Saturdays, Sundays, and Holidays. A Member may have up to three guests after 10:00am on Saturdays, Sundays, and Holidays.
2. No guest may play more than five (5) times in the calendar year no matter how many members have been that guest's host. All guests with a member must check in at the Golf Pro Shop and sign the guest register.
3. All golfing members of Innsbrook Country Club may offer to their friends, relatives, and business associates unaccompanied guest golf privileges. Unaccompanied guests must check in at the Golf Pro Shop and sign the guest register. Unaccompanied guests may tee off only **after** 12:00pm, unless authorized by the Golf Professional, on Saturdays, Sundays, and Holidays. Unaccompanied guests will be allowed to make tee times (based upon availability) for up to four golfers and will be responsible for cart and greens fees and all food and beverage charges.
 - a. Only **two** foursomes of unaccompanied guests will be permitted on the course on any given day.
 - b. Unaccompanied guests shall play only at times when the Golf Professional has determined that other play will not be adversely affected.
4. The host member is responsible for the conduct of his or her guests, including dress code and pace of play. Unaccompanied guests must adhere to ICC dress code and golf course rules.
5. A Member may entertain no more than three (3) guests on Saturdays, Sundays and Holidays and no more than seven (7) guests during a weekday.
6. **Groups of 24:**

Members holding a golfing membership may entertain up to twenty-four (24) guests on Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday and Fridays in accordance with the following restrictions:

 - a. The host member must accompany the group and will be responsible for the proper conduct, dress, and pace of play of all guests.
 - b. Groups of over seven (7) and up to twenty-four (24) will be permitted only on Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday and Fridays. The combined total number of such guests will be limited to 24.
 - c. Members desiring to entertain groups in excess of seven (7) and up to twenty-four (24) must receive prior approval from the Golf Professional. All costs will be billed to the host member.
 - d. After approval of the Golf Professional, the host member shall arrange tee times through the Golf Shop. **The entire group must tee off prior to 11:30am.**



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Groups of 24 (cont.):

- e. Guests will be permitted one round (18 holes) of golf. Golfers from the group will not be eligible to play a second round.
 - f. Golf carts shall be mandatory, weather permitting.
7. Innsbrook Country Club will accept most major credit cards in the Clubhouse, Pro Shop, Pool and Halfway House.

Men's Hole-In-One Club

1. All Innsbrook Country Club Golfing Members are eligible, including Non-Residents. All Innsbrook Country Club Golfing Members will automatically be entered into the Hole-In-One Club, unless you signed the non-participation form and returned it to the office or email must be sent to the Accounting Department accounting@innsbrookcc.com by April 1st.
2. The annual Hole-In-One Club fee will be \$75.00.
3. All Innsbrook Country Club golfing Members will be billed \$75 on their January bill.
4. The Hole-In-One Club winner's pot will be the number of participants x \$75 = pot.
5. The eligible season will begin April 1st until October 31st. At the end of the season, the pot will be divided by the number of Aces to determine dollar amount.
(Example: 100 participants x \$75 = \$7,500 divided by 5 Aces = \$1500 for each Hole-In-One)
6. Your Hole-In-One Club fee must be paid before April 1 or you will not be eligible to participate in the Hole-In-One Club that year.
7. A list of Hole-In-One Club paid participants will be posted in the Pro Shop.
8. No one will be admitted to the Hole-In-One Club after April 1st. *except new members at their join date.
9. The Hole-In-One must be made during a round of 18-hole/or a 9-hole club sponsored event at Innsbrook Country Club. The Ace must be attested by two other players in the round. At least one of them must be an Innsbrook Country Club golfing Member, a family Member over 18, a Guest over 18, or Social Member. The other witness must be any of the above, or a guest over 18 years old. Any Hole-In-One made at Innsbrook Country Club during an 18-hole Club event will qualify for the Hole-In-One Club. Any Club event played from different tees or played as a scramble will also qualify, such as Men's League.



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ARTICLE V: POOL AND WATER PARK – 2021

The Pool and Water Park is available to all Innsbrook Country Club Members holding a Golf Membership, Pool Social Membership, who have pool privileges according to their category, their children under twenty-five (25) years of age, and their guests. * Restrictions Apply.

All users of the pool swim entirely at their own risk.

Lifeguards are on duty only during the hours that the swimming pool is officially open. The lifeguard is employed for your protection and has authority to expel persons from the pool for misconduct or infraction of swimming pool rules. * Exceptions may apply.

Opening Day – Closing Day:

If weather conditions are favorable, the pool will be open for the **Memorial Day** weekend beginning the Friday prior to Memorial Day. The pool will officially close on **Labor Day***. * No swimming or trespassing in the pool area is allowed when the pool is closed. * Exceptions may apply.

The swimming pool may be closed due to thunder, lightning, inclement weather, unforeseen emergencies, or low census. *pool closings will be posted on our website and emails will go out to the members. For special events, the pool may remain open after normal operating hours. Members will be notified accordingly.

Guest Fees / Regulations:

The daily guest fee will be \$8.00 per guest. A Member may have no more than six guests on any given day. More than six guests (per membership) on any one day are considered a “party” and must be scheduled in advance with the Pool Manager. The Member sponsoring the guest(s) is responsible for properly registering the guest(s) and for paying the guest fee. The sponsoring member must remain present at Innsbrook during the entire guest visit. There is no guest fee charged for Grandparents or Nanny/Caretakers of members’ dependent children when accompanied by the dependent children of the primary holder who hold memberships which entitle pool privileges. For all Nanny/Caretakers a written notice from the primary member must be received at Innsbrook and authorized by management prior to admission.

Inflatable Tubes, Mats, Flotation Devices, etc.:

The only inflatable items permitted at the pool are those provided by Innsbrook or arm floaties, or life jackets. Exception: Life jackets are permitted in the pool area for all swimmers.



The New Innsbrok Country Club

General Pool and Safety Rules:

Failure to follow safety rules can result in serious injury to yourself and others and loss of pool and waterslide privileges.

- Everyone must shower before entering the pool.
- Persons having open cuts, sores, or communicable diseases are not permitted in the pool.
- Children, eighteen (18) and under, must be accompanied by an adult.
- Children who are in diapers must wear swim diapers in the pool. All others must wear proper swim attire. Street clothes and under garments are not permitted in the water.
- Animals are not allowed in the pool or the pool area.
- Food and beverages, and coolers may not be brought into the pool or the pool area.
- Only food and beverages purchased from the Club are permitted in the pool area.
- Movement of tables is prohibited except by Pool Staff.
- Running, “rough housing”, or loud noise is prohibited in the pool area.

Water Slide Safety Rules:

- You must be 48” tall or able to swim one pool length unassisted to ride the slide.
- Form line on pool deck, not on slide stairway.
- No tubes, mats or life jackets permitted in flume.
- Only one rider at a time. Doubles, trains or chains are prohibited
- No diving or jumping from flume.
- Enter slide in sitting position.
- Wait for lifeguard’s starting instructions before riding.
- Ride slide feet first either sitting or lying down on back.
- Keep arms and feet inside flume.
- Exit splashdown pool area immediately.
- No running, standing, kneeling, tumbling or stopping in flume.
- Pregnant women and people with a heart or back condition should not use the slide.
- Do not use the slide while under influence of alcohol or drugs.
